Duke Chapel

A symbol of the university, <u>Duke Chapel</u> is at the center of the West Campus. Completed in 1932, the chapel is dominated by a tower housing a 50-bell carillon. The Chapel's bell tower stands 210 ft (64m) tall, making it one of the largest university chapels in the world and an iconic landmark for the University campus and surrounding areas.
